FORGIVENESS OF SINS

1st READING: John 11:25-26 (NLT)

²⁵ Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life, Anyone who believes in me will live, even after dying. ²⁶ Everyone who lives in me and believes in me will never ever die. Do you believe this, Martha?"

2ND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 (NLT)

Let me now remind you, dear brothers and sisters, of the Good News I preached to you before. You welcomed it then, and you still stand firm in it. ² It is this Good News that saves you if you continue to believe the message I told you—unless, of course, you believed something that was never true in the first place.

³ I passed on to you what was most important and what had also been passed on to me. Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said. ⁴ He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, just as the Scriptures said. ⁵ He was seen by Peter and then by the Twelve. ⁶ After that, he was seen by more than 500 of his followers^[d] at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. ⁷ Then he was seen by James and later by all the apostles. ⁸ Last of all, as though I had been born at the wrong time, I also saw him. ⁹ For I am the least of

all the apostles. In fact, I'm not even worthy to be called an apostle after the way I persecuted God's church.

¹⁰ But whatever I am now, it is all because God poured out his special favor on me—and not without results. For I have worked harder than any of the other apostles; yet it was not I but God who was working through me by his grace. ¹¹ So it makes no difference whether I preach or they preach, for we all preach the same message you have already believed.

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 24:1-12

But very early on Sunday morning the women went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. ² They found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. ³ So they went in, but they didn't find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ As they stood there puzzled, two men suddenly appeared to them, clothed in dazzling robes.

⁵ The women were terrified and bowed with their faces to the ground. Then the men asked, "Why are you looking among the dead for someone who is alive? ⁶ He isn't here! He is risen from the dead! Remember what he told you back in Galilee, ⁷ that the Son of Man must be betrayed into the hands of sinful men and be crucified, and that he would rise again on the third day."

⁸ Then they remembered that he had said this. ⁹ So they rushed back from the tomb to tell his eleven disciples—and everyone else—what had happened. ¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and several other women who told the apostles what had happened. ¹¹ But the story sounded like nonsense to the men, so they didn't believe it. ¹² However, Peter jumped up and ran to the tomb to look. Stooping, he peered in and saw the empty linen wrappings; then he went home again, wondering what had happened.

WORSHIP SCHEDULE

✠ May 31 Easter celebration: A renewal of Hope! Outdoor sunrise at 7 AM - weather permitting, or in the gym should the weather not cooperate. Worship at 9 AM will

be in the sanctuary and limited to 90 people, overflow seating will be available in the gym. Worshippers are asked to pick one time to attend this Sunday.

- ✠ June 7-14 (or longer if deemed necessary): Indoor worship with two services, one following the liturgy at 9 AM in the worship center and one relaxed praise worship at 10 AM in the gym. Worshippers will be asked to pick one worship time only each Sunday.

RETURN TO WORSHIP PROTOCOLS:

- Contracted service to professionally clean and disinfect (sanitize all surfaces and a microbial fogging) of all worship spaces each week for at least the next four weeks. Institute increased sanitation/cleaning and hygiene measures at church.
- All people engaging in worship, worship support, or serving **MUST** wear masks (gloves are optional – they keep the wearer safe but are not very effective in keeping others safe) while in the buildings. You may bring your own mask or use the disposable ones provided by Faith Lutheran.
- Sanitation stations will be placed throughout the building at entry points.
- Those with no underlying conditions or who do not have family members with underlying conditions at home are encouraged to consider returning to worship. Family units may sit together (if you live together, you can sit together) in the same pew / area.
- All sanctuary and gathering spaces will have spaced out seating. We will maintain physical distancing in worship (at least six feet, excluding households) by blocking every other pew and encouraging social distancing of worshippers.
- Ushering folks in and out to avoid potential contact between people as they transition.
- Close common areas (fellowship hall, church offices, coffee spaces) for the time being. Entry to worship will be from the Narthex door or, for the gym, from the west and south doors.
- We will refrain from handshakes, touching and hugs, passing plates and printed bulletins until we know that the measures we are taking are sufficient.
- Sunday School and Adult Bible Classes will likely resume in late June or early July.
- Fellowship can occur only outside of the buildings and must follow the social distancing guidelines.
- Paper announcements will be only distributed by gloved ushers following worship to those who desire them.
- We will continue online worship for those who choose to remain at home and for outreach to those not worshipping with us.
